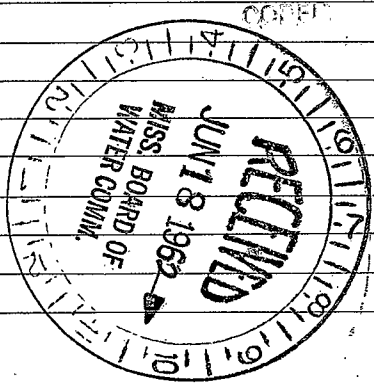

CHAPTER I

THE EARLY HISTORY OF THE UNITED STATES
